- o Artist in Residence for 2024-2025:

Background:

5th grade event, part of Cultural Arts budget (not 5th grade budget)
Work on project with students, resulting in gift/physical art, or performance
Grant to be submitted by June 1st for the following year (question: where does grant come from)

When submitting grant, need artist in mind and need PTA support(no guarantee that grant will be received)

Artist in Residence for 2024-2025

Becca received two quotes for an Artist in Residency for next year. Grant would only cover \$2500 max (requires PTA matching) and there is no guarantee that we will get the grant. We won't know about the grant awards until sometime over the summer. Is the PTA willing to cover the cost of these artists (could be ~\$2300-\$4600 depending on the grant award) in next year's budget? Ms. Riley would love to host Katherine Dilworth. She would come to CES to work with each 5th grade class 5 times. Each child would create a felt piece that the artist would arrange in a final piece to hang in the school. This could also be the class gift, so part of the budget could be applied.
